Uncle Sam to Prepare For Military Medicine

Instructors in Sanitation and Medicine Furnished by War and Navy Departments Will Be Placed in 95 Medical Colleges.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 25.—(United Press)—Following the general program of "preparedness," instructors in military sanitation and medicine furnished by the war and navy departments probably will be placed in 95 of the foremost medical colleges of the United States, February 1.

This action is intended to equip our institutions of medicine and surgery with a course of training that will fit the future medical profession of the country to promote betterment of health in times of peace, and to prepare it for its duty in any untoward crisis.

It followed a conference in Washington, January 6, in which deans of medical schools in all sections of the country, members of the advisory commission of the Council of National Defense, member of the committee of American physicians, and high officers of the army and navy participated.

The invitations to the conference were extended by Secretary of War Baker following the suggestion of the Council of National Defense which had the hearty endorsement of the committee of American physicians. The latter organization is strong in advocacy of medical preparedness and desired to cooperate with the government to prepare the profession for their patriotic duty in times of stress.

It is the idea of the council to furnish the graduating classes of medical schools with a rudimentary military training and it is estimated that this action will furnish 3000 young medi-

This move in medical preparedness has the unique distinction of claiming the support of both militarists and pacifists in that the physician and surgeon is engaged in the humane efforts of life saving throughout the horrible destructions of war.

Such a course of training is not contemplated with the sole thought of war, but also that future members of the profession may be prepared to face the problems arising from national calamity and catastrophe in times of peace.

Pay \$1.50 For Wal-lowa Contract Wheat

Enterprise, Oregon, Deal for 275-Acre Ranch, 1917, Crop Is At a Record Price.

Enterprise, Or., Jan. 25.—(Special)—An agreement establishing the record price for contract wheat was entered into a few days ago between H. A. Quesberry, W. R. Holmes, president of the Wallowa National Bank, of this city, and owner of the property farmed by Mr. Quesberry, and C. R. Elliott, a retired stockgrower and wheatraiser.


C. R. Elliott agreed to pay Mr. Quesberry and Mr. Holmes \$1.50 a bushel for all merchantable wheat to be raised upon 275 acres during 1917.
