### Rural Carrier Examination.

The United States Civil Service commission has announced an examination for the county of Union, Oregon, to be held at La Grande, on February 24, 1917, to fill the position of rural carrier at Elgin, and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other postoffices in the above-mentioned county. The examination will be open only to male citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a postoffice in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in form No. 1977. This form and application blanks may be obtained from the offices mentioned above or from the United States Civil Service commission at Washington, D. C. Applications should be forwarded to the commission at Washington at the earliest practicable date.

Among the many favorable press notices of his concert is the following from The Dalles Chronicle of November 10, 1916:

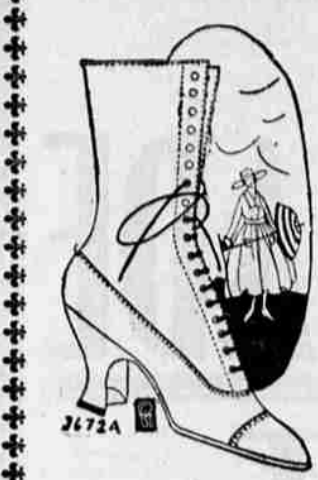

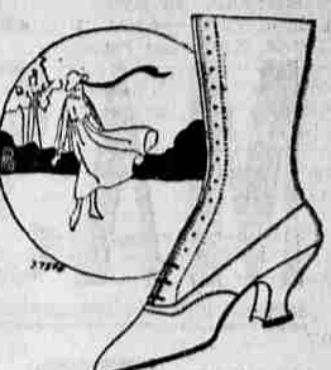
February 4 Is Young People's Day. February 4 is young people's day at the Presbyterian church. All services will be planned with this in view.
