Champion Bull Purchased by Union Man

Challenge Plate Third Said to Be One of Best Shorthorns in America.

It is the breeder that makes the breed. A broad vision and faith in the future and in the breed has characterized the pure breed stockmen of this county. This has again been demonstrated in the past few days, when W. J. Townley of Union, one of our local Shorthorn men, bought Challenge Plate III, at the great Canadian Shorthorn sale, held at Toronto, Canada, February 1-2, 1917.

This bull was calved October 16,

1913. Robert Miller of Stouffville, Canada, former owner of Challenge Plate III, says among other things of this sire, "He is a grand sire, and I believe, the best roan bull I know any place. He is a Lovelace. He is as good a bull as ever Ringmaster was, and he is like him in size."

In other words he should be one of the best Shorthorn bulls in America.

La Grande Officers To Meet Pendleton
