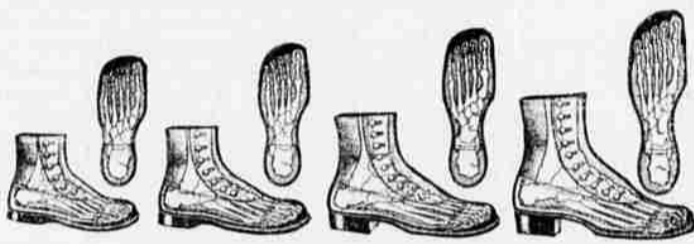

WILLIAM BLOOM OBITUARY
William Bloom died suddenly of
heart failure at his home in Cove,
Ore., February 1, 1917. He was born
in Cove, April 2, 1864, and was the
son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Bloom, and
a grandson of James Bloom, first set-
tlers in Cove. They crossed the plains
in 1862.

He was the first boy born in Cove,
and spent his life there, residing for
the past several years on one of
Cove's unique 40-acre fruit tracts
within the corporation.

He was married to Miss Cora Van
Schoonhoven, October 27, 1897, and
leaves his wife and four children, Mis-
kell, Haskell, Violet and Edward; two
brothers, Dr. P. M. Bloom of Nampa,
Idaho, and Frank Bloom of Cove; and
two sisters, Mrs. Emma Childs and
Mrs. Adda Giles of Spokane, Wash.
The funeral services were conducted
at the M. E. church by Rev. C. C.
Pratt after which the remains were
placed at rest in the Cove cemetery.
