These are authentic quotations from the pamphlet on babies prepared by Dr. L. Emmett Holt of Columbia university and Dr. Henry L. K. Shaw of Union university.

Necessary things to prepare for the baby are: Three-quarter yard, thin lightweight flannel, 2 lightweight woolen blankets, 3 cotton and wool undershirts, 3 flannel skirts, 3 outing flannel gowns, 4 cotton slips, 18 diapers 18 inches square, 18 diapers 22

inches square, 1 box borie acid, 1 box talcum powder, 1 piece Castile soap, 1-4 pound sterile gauze, 1-4 pound sterile absorbent cotton, 24 safety pins large and small, one set of scales.
