During the Roosevelt administration he was postmaster at La Grande, and during the Taft administration receiver of the United States land office in Portland. Mr. Ardrey is survived by a wife, Mrs. Ella Ardrey, a daughter, Ruth Ardrey, and a son, Nathaniel Ardrey. The funeral services were held from the Holman parlors and interment was in Milwaukee cemetery.

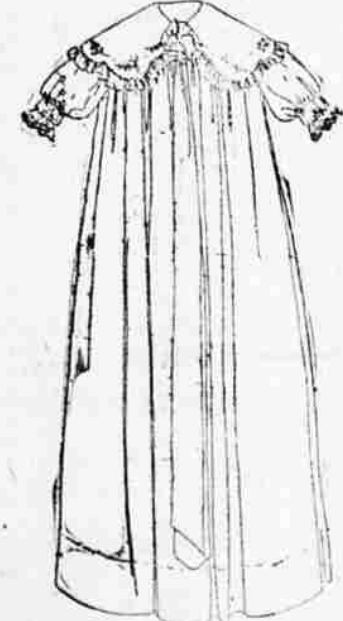
