**Ex-U. S. Marines Are
Being Called by Wire**

Washington, D. C., Feb. 19.—Calling trained men to the colors by wire is the method adopted by the United States marines who, today, are sending hundreds of telegrams to former "soldiers of the sea" whose services are especially desired in the face of a national crisis.

Telegrams sent from headquarters to individual ex-marines read as follows: "Marine corps needs her trained soldiers. Please communicate with nearest recruiting station. If you cannot return to colors yourself, please secure one recruit for marine corps." The telegram is signed by Brigadier General John A. Lejeune.

Milk and Keep It Clean**

These Are Authentic Quotations From the Pamphlet On Babies By Dr. L. Emmett Holt of Columbia University and Dr. L. K. Shaw of Union University.

If you must have a bottle baby, buy clean milk and keep it clean. FRESHNESS is more important than richness. Buy it only in bottles. Dipped milk is unclean and dangerous. Put all your milk on ice and keep it there. Never keep milk in an open vessel. Bottles, dishes and hands used about the milk should be sterilized. Boil all new nipples; wash in soap and water after using and place in a covered glass containing boric acid or baking soda and water. Rinse before using again.
