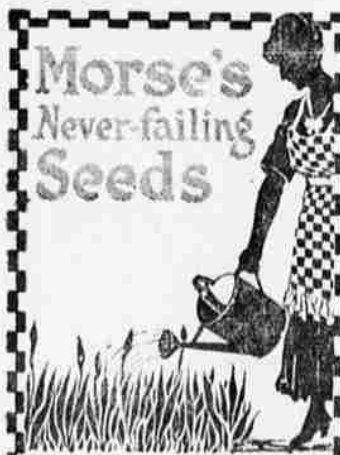

E. B. Kidder and E. L. Allen of Kamela went over to the brakes on McCay to look after their stock.

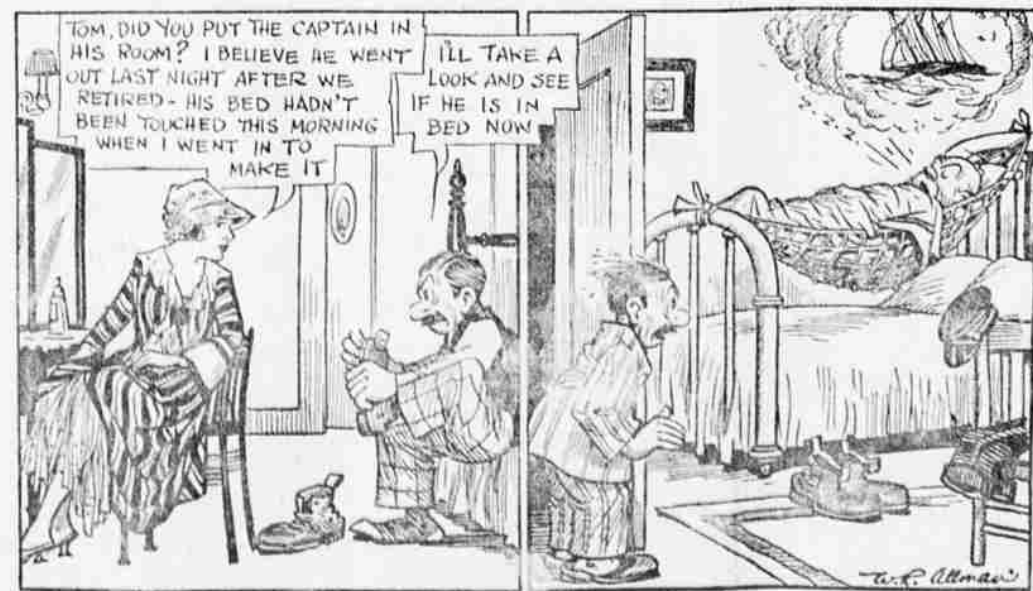
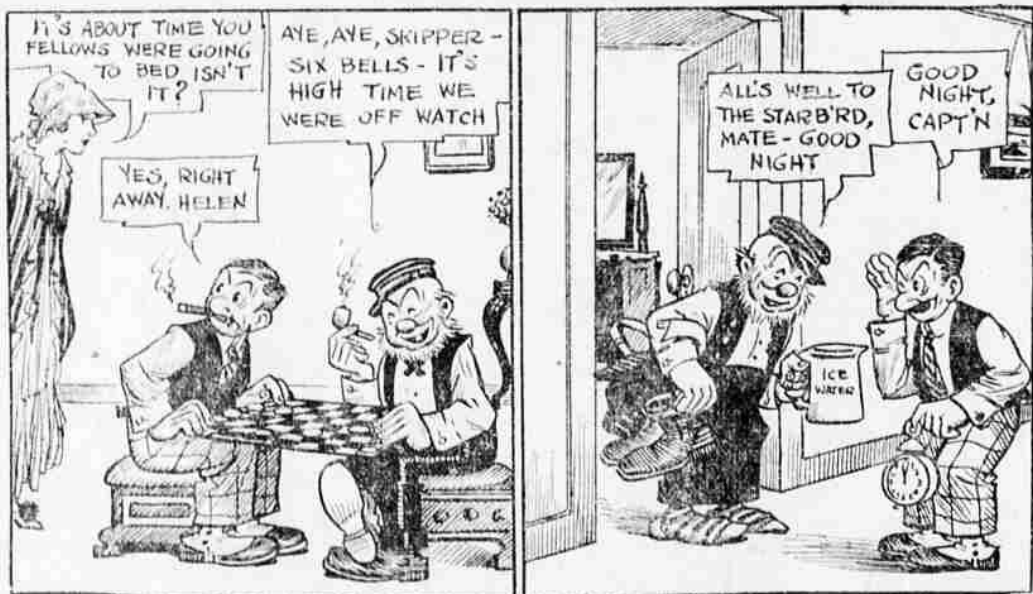
The Chase brothers were in Kamela yesterday and took out a load of provisions on their skis, that being the only way it is possible to get anything into the country at present.
