950 Applications Received During Past Six Weeks; Rush Is Over

May Take Year for Department of Interior to Finish Work on Filings, Due to Lack of Knowledge of Filers—Copies of Circulars Governing the Act Are at Land Office and May Be Had on Request.

Applications under the stock raising homestead law received by the local land office now aggregate 950 since January 2. The officials are of the opinion that the rush is now practically over. All filings have been received and suspended pending receipt of instructions governing the act from the department of the interior; instructions have been forwarded and the adjudications of the applications by the local office will proceed at once. Many of the filings are imperfect, due to the fact that the applicants did not have a full understanding of the requirements. This will necessarily require considerable correspondence and no doubt it will consume over a year to complete the work.

A supply of circulars, number 523 and 524, governing the act, have been received by the local office for distribution. Copies may be obtained by calling at the office or addressing a letter to the register and receiver, land office, La Grande, Oregon.
