Codfish Balls.
A pint of codfish minced fine and scalded, a quart of hot boiled potatoes mashed fine or put through potato ricer. Mix fish and potatoes together, add one-fourth of a cupful of butter, about as much cream, a little pepper and two well beaten eggs. Keep all as hot as possible. Bent together with a fork. Roll lightly in flour and fry like doughnuts in very hot lard and beef drippings, half of each.

Home Cookery

Chicken Pie.
Boil two fowls until very tender in just enough water to cover well; salt and let cool in the broth. In the morning pull off the meat in neat pieces, adding smaller joints whole if desired; lay in a buttered dish and add a few small potato balls and onions of the same size, both cooked. Make a rich gravy of part of the broth, pour over the chicken and vegetables and cover with a good pastry crust. The sides of the dish may be lined with pastry if desired. Cut fancy gashes to let out steam. Cook just long enough to brown crust richly.

Baked Hash With Eggs.
Two cupfuls cold meat of any kind put through the food chopper, three cupfuls of potatoes chopped, but not quite so fine. Mix in chopping bowl with a cupful of juice from can of tomatoes. Put in a greased pan, bake in slow oven fifty minutes. Remove from oven. With a tablespoon make six small holes in the top, break an egg in each hole, return to the oven for ten minutes. Serve on hot plates and garnish with beet pickle.

Clam Soup.
Boil four medium sized potatoes cut into dice until soft. Drain and add a quart of milk. When just below the boiling point add twenty-five clams chopped fine. If not in a double boiler stir frequently to prevent burning. Cream a tablespoonful of butter and a tablespoonful of flour and stir into the soup, taking care that it does not lump. Add pepper and salt to taste and a bit of chopped parsley. Serve at once.
