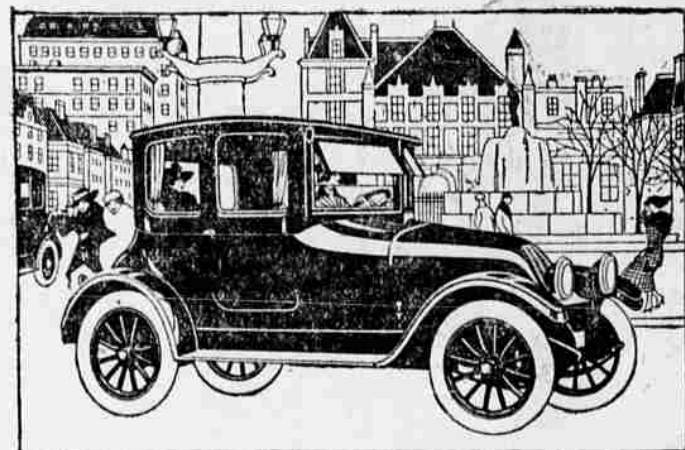
NOTICE OF SALE
