NEW YORK POLICE MEET SPEEDERS HALF WAY

New York, March 15.—(United Press)—The police of this city today inaugurated an experiment to ascertain whether citizens are willing to cooperate with the city authorities in enforcing the law. When a policeman spots a speeder, he does not arrest the offender at once unless the offense is flagrant, but sends his name and license number to headquarters.

The speeder's record is investigated and if it is found that he has committed a similar offense previously, he is summoned before a magistrate to plead his case. If it is evident that automobilists do not appreciate this treatment, the police department, after a thorough test, will abandon the system of giving speeders a chance.

COULDN'T CLOSE
SALOONS, SO TRY IT
ON GROCERY STORES
Buenos Aires, March 15.—(United Press)—Having tried and failed to close the saloons on Sunday, the Buenos Aires city government is making a similar experiment with the grocery stores. The idea is to give the clerks a day's rest a week. It is not a religious movement. Most grocery stores really do keep their front entrance shut, which the saloons never did, but they do a tremendous side-door trade.

1. A man and a woman are besieged in a rude hut on a tropical island of the South Pacific by two men drunk with gin and opium. The attackers set fire to the house, but the pair inside are saved by the force of a severe hurricane which sweeps enormous trees in its path and quenches the blaze in a torrential downpour of rain.

2. Later the couple is entrapped in a cave on the island, when an earthquake causes a mass of dirt and rock to cover the mouth of the opening. Within their living tomb, they cling together, frightened by the powerful throbs which shake the very heart of the hills.

3. Escaping from this threatened death, the two have barely time to escape to the open sea when a terrific volcanic explosion breaks the little island into a thousand bits, and it sinks slowly into the sea, while a downpour of scalding steam and white-hot rocks keeps the refugees in fear of their lives.

4. Finally, aboard a boat where they think safety lies, they are attacked from within by the men who had besieged them on the island, and from without by a horde of cannibals, who are seeking shelter from the volcano. Fearful of the consequences if the savages get aboard, and being unable to keep them off in any other way, the men on the ship hurl sticks of dynamite among the naked barbarians on the rafts below. It is needless to say that these efforts of defense are successful.
