STONE ASKS FOR LIST OF SHIPS WANTING ARMS

Washington, March 15.—(United Press)—The senate unanimously adopted Senator Stone's resolution asking the Commerce secretary to supply the names of all sea-going vessels applying to the United States for registration.

It is believed Stone intends to ascertain whether foreign-owned ships are seeking American registry for the purpose of getting arms.

British owners of the German prize ship Appam filed application for a writ of mandate to force the prize crew to surrender the vessel in accordance with the Supreme court's decision.

The senate voted 37 to 26 confirming President Wilson's appointment of Doctor Carey Grayson as naval medical inspector with the rank of rear Admiral.
