THE ADAMSON LAW UPHELD.

The Adamson law controversy has resulted in a complete victory for the men. The railroads accepted it and put it into effect voluntarily. The Supreme Court held it was constitutional, admitted that it was wage regulation, and held that Congress had ample power, begotten of concern for the public welfare, to legislate upon such a subject.

THE JOSEPH-LA GRANDE ROAD.

Union and Wallowa Counties can well afford to work together for a good road from La Grande to Joseph. It will be of mutual benefit and permit an interchange of visits and traffic between the people of the two counties, and also give the tourists access to the beauties of Wallowa Lake.

If this movement is successful Union and Wallowa counties would appropriate \$10,000 and the Federal Government \$20,000, or a total of \$40,000. While this amount may seem small in road building, it is a starter, and if carried over for a period of 5 years as it is planned it would be a fine start on the road.

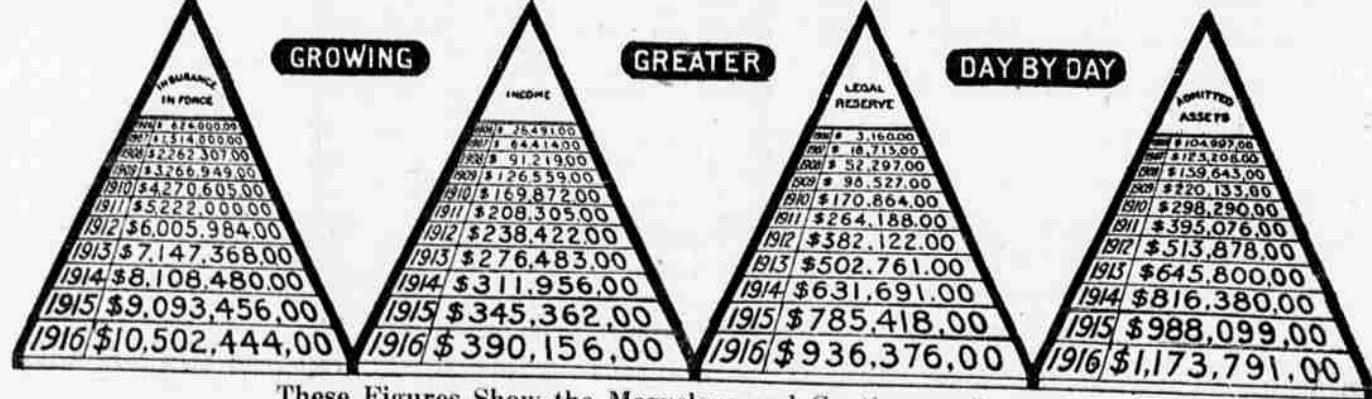
