No End to Tong War.  
San Francisco, March 24.—There will be no thought of peace among the warring Chinese tongmen of this coast before March 18, 1919, Wong Kee, acting president of the Bing Kong tong told a peace committee with which he was called to confer. He declares that the Bow Leong tong long has been persecuted and that the Bing Kongs have received a \$50,000 war fund from it and propose to use the money for no other purpose than to secure revenge.

### North Powder News

North Powder, Mar. 21.—(Special)  
—March 21 was the day appointed by the Federal bankruptcy court for the final hearing and opening of the bids for the Forstrom-Pilcher company bankrupt stock, which was thrown into the bankruptcy court some time ago. The creditors and several attorneys representing the different creditors were present at the hearing. The following attorneys were present: C. H. Finn and George Cochran of La Grande, J. J. Heilner, J. H. Nichols, W. H. Strayer, of Baker, C. P. Olson, H. R. Dewart, Mr. Tizer of Portland,

Hess & Hess of North Powder, J. H. Bpashong, acting receiver for Mr. Knapp, Judge A. M. Cannon, referee, and his stenographer. Nine different bids were submitted on the stock of general merchandise and the automobile garage equipment and stock of goods in connection therewith ranging in price from \$12,000 to \$16,108.41. These bids ranged from 50 to 68 per

cent of the invoice price. One bid was submitted offering twenty cents on the dollar for the stock of goods and all outstanding claims against the Company, excepting the Pilcher, Hutchinson and Kelsey claims which would be adjusted independent of the other proceedings. The auto advertised for sale with the stock of goods proved to belong to another party as the title had

not passed to the company. Those who were interested in the proceedings that were present from outside points were the following: T. J. Scroggin, cashier of the U. S. National bank of La Grande, A. T. Hill of La Grande, W. J. Townley and Will Vogel of Union, J. F. O'Bryant of Haines, Mr. Jorden of the Jordan & where names were not obtained.
