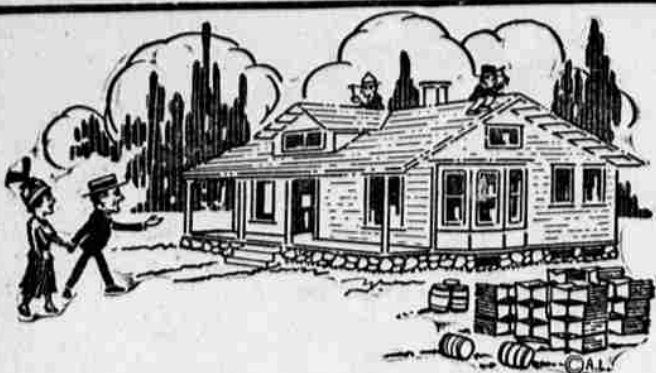

Englishwomen Smoke At Work in Offices

London, March 15.—(By mail)—(United Press)—Women in England who smoke outnumber their American sisters possessed of the same weakness. One sees in the restaurants as many who smoke as who do not. It remained for the war to remove the next to last restriction. They are now smoking while at work in at least one London office. The last restriction will go when they are seen smoking in the streets.

Male army clerks always have been permitted to smoke while at work. Falling heir to many of the clerk's jobs, the women have fallen heir to the habit also. The only regulation prescribed is that they must not smoke before 11 o'clock or after 3 p. m.

POOR FOLKS IN COURT TO HAVE BEST ATTORNEYS

New York, March 31.—(United Press)—Because unscrupulous lawyers have caused poor people to get unfair treatment in New York courts, a corps of the best lawyers money can buy is being organized under the direction of The Public Defender to see that the poor get a square deal.

John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and other wealthy men are backing the plan financially. The Public Defense bureau will open Monday. Each case will be prepared for trial by experts and a capable member of the staff assigned to defend it in court.

The plan is fathered by members of the New York bar, who say that, crooked practitioners have not only dealt unfairly with their poor clients but have in some instances treated their cases in such manner as to lead them into the life of the confirmed criminal.

Spanish Aliens Must Explain.
Madrid, March 31.—(United Press)—All aliens found in Spain, beginning Sunday, who have no passports will be subject to fine and expulsion. No aliens will be permitted to enter Spain without a passport after Sunday. At that time also a systematic registration of all aliens will be undertaken. This measure is taken because the country has been overrun with spies, a small army of whom have been keeping submarine captains informed as to the sailing of all vessels from Spanish ports.

Tuberculosis Fast Killing Off Indians

Washington, March 31.—(United Press)—The fast thinning ranks of the Indian are seriously threatened with the scourge of tuberculosis, according to the Office of Indian Affairs—official guardian for more than 300,000 members of the red race today.

Prevention of the spread of this dread disease, which is more prevalent among the Indians than any other race, is occupying most of the office's time. Trachoma, an eye disease, is the next most serious affliction among Indians. Uncleanliness and alcohol are blamed. A campaign of education to curb the two evils has been started.

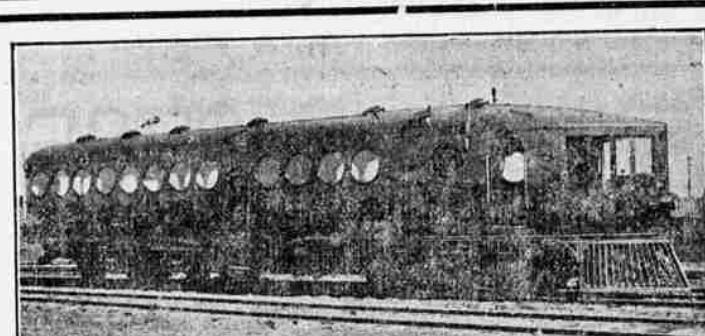
