The receipts from the entertainment will be shared between the two schools, the La Grande portion to defray student body expenses, the Baker share to help pay the expenses of the trip. It is the wish of the two schools to bring about a closer relationship between the two student bodies and to establish a kindred spirit between the two towns. La Grande's students are invited to Baker next year and they are working hard to make this visiting between the two schools an annual event. The club is under the supervision of Mrs. A. C. Strange, and is accompanied by the Baker high school orchestra. The admission is 15 and 25 cents, including reserved seats, which may be obtained at the usual places.
