INDIANS SETTING THE PACE IN STOCK BREEDING IN U. S.

Washington, April 12.—(United Press)—Indians are setting a rapid pace in stock breeding Indian Commissioner Cato Sells announced today. Sells is arranging purchase of 5,000 heifers, largely Herefords; 500 milch cows, 500 Hereford and Shorthorn bulls and 500 young mares out of Indian funds to improve the aborigines' stock farms. More than \$2,000,000 has been spent out of Indian funds in the last three years for stock, Sells said. In every case, he said, the investment was paid.
