The match April 25th is for a purse of \$200, winner takes all. The money is now posted with the United States National Bank. Berg however is guaranteed \$50 to cover expenses, should he lose the match.

O'Neill is confident he will win the coming match as he is in better condition than he was for the former contest and is willing to back his judgment that he can beat Berg with a nice-sized side bet.

Al Bridges, local boiler maker and some wrestler is working regularly with O'Neill. Mr. Bridges is credited with being a very strong man and it is said that during his vacation he spent much time tearing up trees by the roots and pushing over untenanted shacks for amusement and recreation. Pat Foley, local strong man and all around athlete, is also working evenings with O'Neill in preparation for the coming contest. Foley and Bridges will wrestle in the preliminaries. This event promises to be the "big thing" of the evening as both men weigh over two hundred pounds. The beef trust will sink into insignificance as compared to this contest.

Fritz Lottes, undefeated local 140 pound wrestler and Willie Pearce, who has demonstrated on many occasions that he can go some will tangle in one of the preliminaries.

The program at the Arcade theatre on April 25th should be the best thing from an athletic standpoint ever staged in La Grande.
