Two hundred and twenty-three thousand feet of celluloid or forty-two miles of film, were taken for William Fox' "A Daughter of the Gods" which comes to Sherry's theatre April 28 and 29.

Twelve hundred women were employed in Jamaica to make the magnificent costumes in "A Daughter of the Gods?"

Annette Kellermann, star of "A Daughter of the Gods" and the greatest water sprite of the century, is a native of Australia?

Twenty thousand persons appear in many of the stupendous scenes of William Fox' million dollar picture?
