

London, April 21.—(United Press)—Two German destroyers were sunk and a third possibly destroyed when an enemy vessel attempted a raid on Dover, the admiralty announced.

**Opponents of Conscription**  
**Start Filibuster Tactics**

Washington, April 21.—(United Press)—Opponents of the conscription bill this afternoon started filibuster tactics to delay the measure. Senator Thompson demanded regular order consideration of the "spy bill at the expiration of the morning's business." A score of anti-conscriptionists predicted draft riots, if the conscription bill passes. The House military committee voted twelve to eight, favoring the general staff arm bill with the amendment, "authorizing" the President to call for volunteers if he wishes, before the selective draft is tried.

**Armed Merchantman Arrives Saafely.**

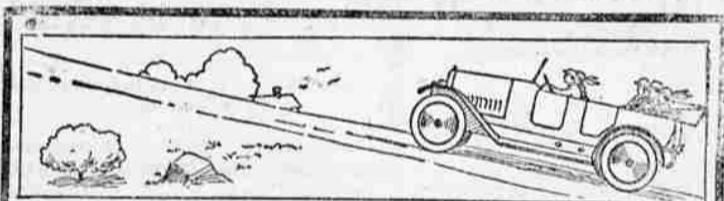
Paris, April 21.—(United Press)—The armed American merchantman Omega arrived safely in a French port.

**Foreign Flags to Fly In Washington.**

This construction eliminates the possibility of noise and reduces wear to a minimum. The carburetor is extremely high. The intake manifold is cast inside the cylinder block and the air for the carburetor is taken off the exhaust pipe, which insures thoroughly vaporized gas and high mileage. Note the combination of water pump and fan, both belt driven. This is a Mitchell feature which is being paid the compliment of imitation. Also note the Vacuum Feed is mounted on the engine block, no twisting of connections as when mounted on the body. The Mitchell cylinder head is quickly detachable and exposes the valves and pistons for attention. The electrical equipment is the double unit type, generator for generating and a starter for starting, all gear driven.

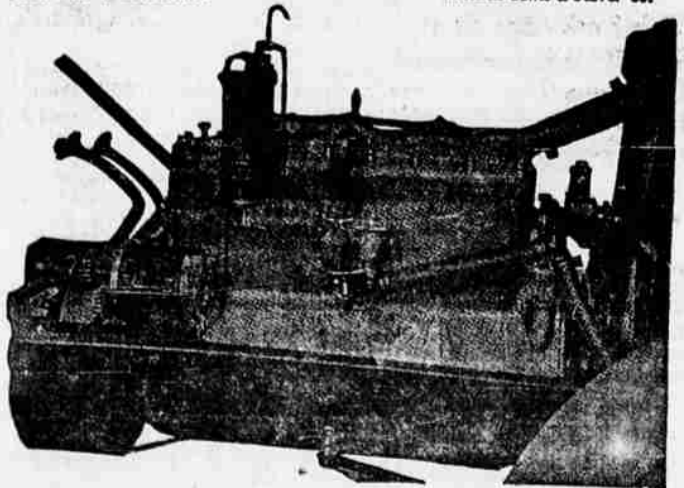
