ceremonies of the afternoon were held near the depot where the flagpole had been erected. The flagpole was the contribution of the O.-W. R. & N. Co. The speakers spoke from a flatcar which had been decorated with flags and seats provided for the speakers. Postmaster E. E. Bragg was chairman of the day and appropriately introduced the speakers and carried out the program like clockwork. Bishop O'Reilly was not able to be present on account of illness. His place in the program was taken by A. W. Perley, of the O.-W. R. & N. Co., who spoke briefly and forcibly upon the duties of citizens in the present crisis.

C. I. Smith, O.-W. R. & N. agriculturist, painted a beautiful picture of the flag raising on Lookout Mountain at the Battle of Chattanooga and declared that the patriotic duty of all Americans who did not go to the front was to increase the food production of the nation so as to sustain the soldiers, whether Americans or Allies who were fighting the battles of humanity.

Dr. M. K. Hall presented in clear concise fashion the opportunity of doing patriotic service by joining the Red Cross, whose work in peace and war he described.

A. L. Palmer made a brilliant oration, paying tribute to the flag, and urging upon all the necessity of keeping it unstained and unsoiled as it had been in the great crisis of '78, '12, '48, '98.

The speaker of the day, C. E. Anderson, told of the need of present day patriotism, and on behalf of the O.-W. shopmen thanked the public for their participation in the great patriotic event, and the O.-W. R. & N. for their co-operation in presenting the men and the public the beautiful flagpole. The flag was then raised by the G. A. R. and Company M in true military fashion, the thousands assembled cheered as the beautiful flag floated to the breeze, and all assembled then pledged in serious and solemn fashion their allegiance to the Stars and Stripes. The Boy Scouts then sang



a song telling of their love and loyalty to the flag. Judge Thomas H. Crawford was the concluding speaker and he thrilled the audience with a stirring address telling of the justice of America's position, that America was not waging an aggressive war but defending itself against aggression, and fighting to maintain its rights for life, liberty and happiness as it had in the days of '76.

The bands played, the crowd dispersed, and the exercises concluded with the throng dispersing feeling that the community was the better for their expression of their patriotism and their loyalty to the flag that was felt in every heart, young or old.
