Union, Oregon, April 24.—(Special)—The Union County Track meet will be held at Union on May 12. TOASTS TO TWO FLAGS.

On July 4, 1903, at a dinner in Shanghai, the British consul toasted the British flag. He said: "Gentlemen, here is to the Union Jack, the flag of flags, the flag that has floated on every sea for a thousand years, the flag on which the sun has never set." It was a strong sentiment and the Americans were just a little awed until Mr. Eli Perkins was called to toast the Stars and Stripes. Looking into the proud faces of the Englishmen, he said:

"To the Stars and Stripes. "Gentlemen, here is to the Stars and Stripes of the new republic. When the setting sun lights up her golden stars in the ice bound regions of Alaska, the rising sun salutes her on the rock bound coast of Maine. It is the flag of Liberty, never lowered to a foe, and the only flag which has ever whipped that 'flag on which the sun never sets.' And may the Stars



and Stripes and the Red Cross of Britannia never clash again in mortal strife, but together, floating over millions of the same blood, form the bulwark of the world's hope, and dictate peace to the warring powers of Christendom for all time to come."
