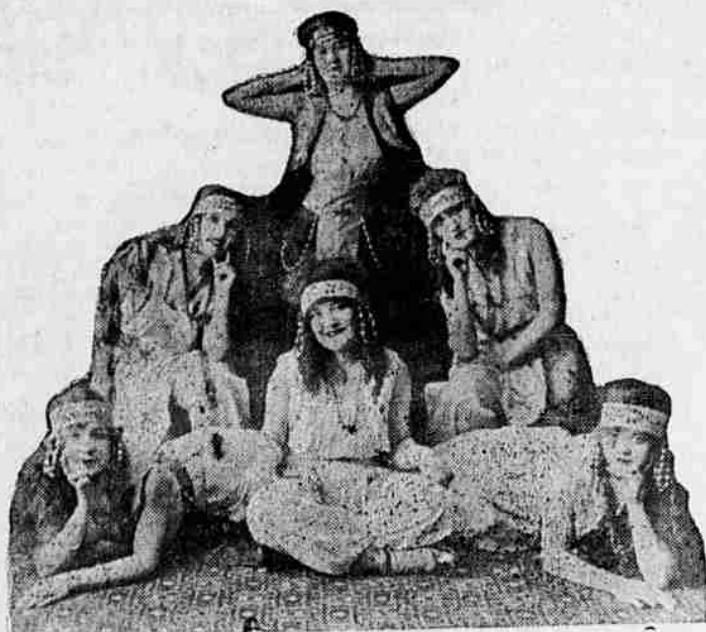

"MORE FOOD IS PATRIOTISM," WISCONSIN SLOGAN.

Madison, Wis., April 28.—(United Press)—"More food is Patriotism," the slogan of the state agricultural college, is being spread broadcast throughout Wisconsin today on "war stickers," on bill-boards and on buildings in the farm sections.

Wisconsin was a leader in the food mobilization movement, the legislature having passed a law creating a council of state defense several weeks ago. Since then the farm movement has been jammed home through many agencies, even the phone companies helping by spreading broadcast daily weather reports for the guidance of farmers.

Senator Roy P. Wilcox, Eau Claire, is fighting to get a bill through the Legislature providing a civilian soldiery for Wisconsin. The bill would require the taking of a muster roll of all those disqualified from enlistment and have them serve the country in some other capacity.

NEBRASKA CONCENTRATING ON CORN AND BARLEY.

Lincoln, Neb., April 28.—(United Press)—Under the direction of University of Nebraska agricultural experts farmers of Nebraska today are fighting for the greatest corn and barley crops ever grown in the state. Baked in their efforts for bumper wheat crops because winter wheat was killed and plowed up, the state is planning to do its share of the national food mobilization campaign through new planting and increase of acreage. Barley will be practically a new problem for most Nebraska farmers, as it has been grown but little in the past though the climate is admirably suited for it.

TESSIE BATTALIONS OFF FOR THE FRONT.

London, April 28.—(United Press)—Two Tessie Battalions, composed mostly of marriagable blondes, are ready to sail for France to take up their work as the pioneer units of the Womens' Auxiliary Army. They are clerks, housemaids and waitresses and are generally easy to look upon.

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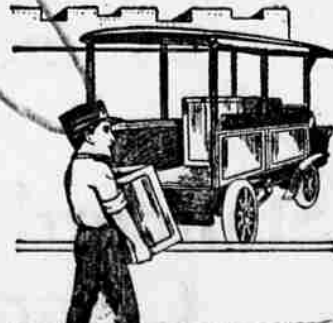
