### Waste Paper Worth Money.

Portland, Ore., May 7.—(United Press)—The gathering of waste paper is a patriotic duty by the Oregon Patriotic Service League. Beginning today the league will pay \$20 a ton for newspapers and magazines tied in compact bundles and delivered to the league's warehouse in Portland. Transportation charges will be deducted and half of the net amount paid by the league will be sent to the school, club or committee collecting the paper and the other half to the local patriotic fund. The fund realized from these sales will care for not only local patriotic needs, but foreign relief and the Belgian children's food fund. Today is Waste Paper day throughout Oregon, but the league intends to keep open its offer to buy waste paper. Governor Withycombe heartily endorses the plan.

An agricultural experiment is to be tried out on the Tuttle and Wade farms this year, in an attempt to find some crop rotation for our summer fallow land. Gerald Tuttle, "Cap" Tuttle, Walter Wade and a few others have just received a car load of seed peas, about 500 sacks, and will sow 500 acres of summer fallow to peas. These peas are not the legumes used as cow feed but are table varieties. Two kinds will be sown the first year, a long pod and a short pod plant. A manufacturing establishment has contracted for the entire crop and will use the peas in preparing certain foods for the market.

Blanche Sweet in Stirring American Photoplay.

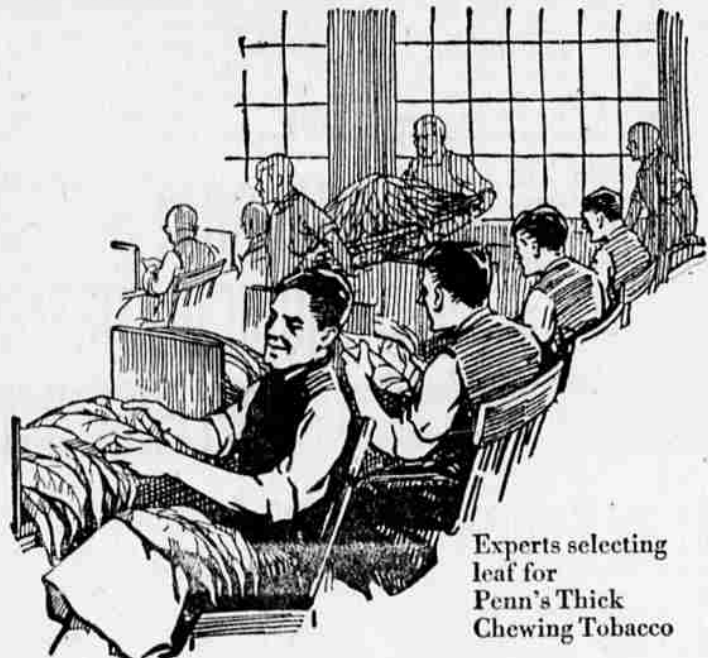
