DANISH EX-CHAMPION TAKES FIRST FALL IN 21 MINUTES AND SECOND IN SEVEN MINUTES.

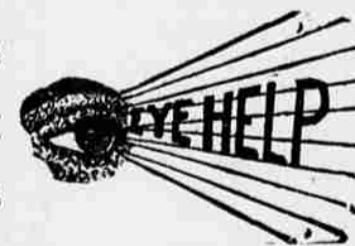
