REDCROSS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT

All those wishing to join any of the following classes will meet at the Y. M. C. A. on Saturday at 8 p. m.:
I.—First Aid—
1. Instructor must be a physician authorized by First Aid Bureau, Washington, D. C.
2. Members of classes should be enrolled—fee 50c a person.
3. Maximum number of pupils in each class, 25.
4. Certificates issued to persons successfully passing examinations.
5. Text Books, 50 cents each.
II.—Elementary Hygiene and Home Care of the Sick—
1. Instructor must be a graduate nurse recommended by local or state nursing service committee and approved by the Bureau of Instruction for Women, American Red Cross, Washington, D. C.
2. Members of classes should be enrolled, 50c a person.
3. Maximum number of pupils in each class, 25.
4. Certificates issued to persons successfully passing examinations.
5. Text Books, 50 cents each.
III.—Dietetics—
1. Instruction authorized by Bureau of Nursing Service.
2. Members of classes enrolled—fee 50c a person.
3. Text book, \$1.00 each.
4. Certificates issued to pupils passing the examination.
IV.—Preparation of Surgical Dressings—
1. Course consists of 8 lessons of 3 hours each.
2. Maximum number of pupils in each class, 20.
3. Classes under direction of instructors appointed by Red Cross Chapter and authorized by Bureau of Nursing Service.
4. Certificates issued to persons passing examination.
Competent instructors have been secured for these courses. 5-25-26
