OSTEOPATHIC LAW IS NOW IN EFFECT

The attorney general has ruled on the new osteopathic law. The following letter giving the details was received by Dr. Ingle:

Portland, Ore., May 15.—Dear Doctor: We wrote you some time ago that we had been unable to advise fully as to the privileges accorded to us under the new law, because of the fact we had been unable to secure a ruling from the Attorney General regarding the narcotic phase of the question and that we would advise you fully as soon as possible.

It affords us a great deal of pleasure, at this time, to be able to say to you that this ruling has been made and that, according to the opinion of the Attorney General, the osteopaths of Oregon now come under the Harrison Act and are entitled to the use

of narcotics in accordance with the provisions of that Act, on the same conditions as the medical men.

The present law, therefore, recognizes osteopaths as "physicians and surgeons" and entitles them to practice "Osteopathy and the Science of Healing as taught in the branches and embraced in the subjects covered by said examination." The subjects for examination being anatomy, physiology, chemistry, surgery, bacteriology, histology, pathology, gynecology, obstetrics, theory and practice of osteopathy, diagnosis.

As you may see, the subjects cover the entire field of therapeutics and we are practically unlimited in practice. We are authorized to issue any legal certificate required by law from any physician and to practice surgery without limitation. Also, those who have been licensed to practice osteopathy in Oregon under previously ex-

isting laws will be issued a license to practice under the new law upon making application therefore. In fact we believe that we now have the best law in the United States.

Legislative Committee.
The new law was opposed in the legislature but passed both houses with a big majority—the vote in the Senate being 24 for and one against the bill.

The law requires of the osteopaths the same amount of college work as is required of the eclectic, allopath or homeopath. The examinations have been and will continue to be the same for all and are given by the Oregon State Board of Medical Examiners which is composed of one osteopathic physician and five medical physicians.

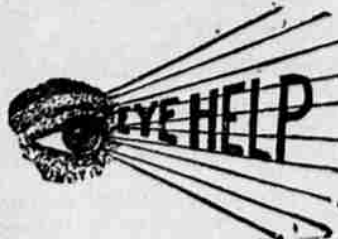

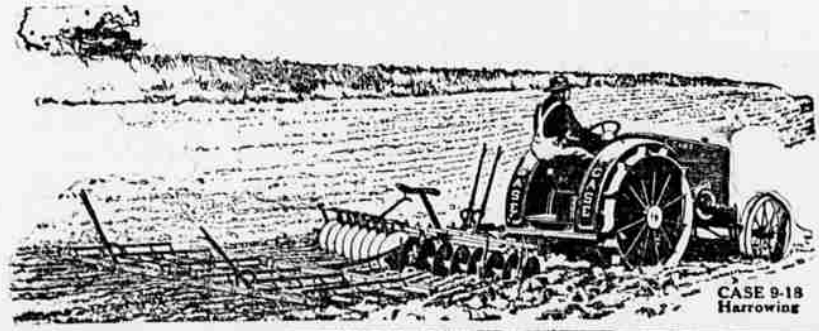
