How Pittsfield Did.

Pittsfield, Mass., recently closed down all business for one hour and devoted this period exclusively to obtaining subscriptions. The city was divided into districts, and canvassed by teams comprising 1200 men and women. Out of a population of 47,000 people, subscriptions were obtained from 9,335, totalling nearly \$2,250,000. The apportioned amount for this territory was \$1,600,000. Subscriptions were obtained from 5,000 of 7,000 employees of the city's largest industry, and in one department store, 317 girls subscribed for \$17,000.
