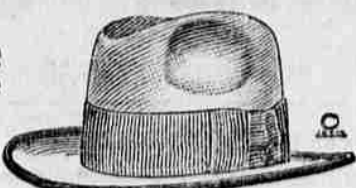

He is ably supported by a company without compare so far as unity and harmony of action is concerned. Not the least effective scene in the entire play is that of presenting Algy at a Christmas celebration with what is nearest to his heart, the Vicar's daughter he left behind. There is beauty and charm throughout, and this final scene makes a new, bright and fitting conclusion.
