#### FREE MOVING PICTURE SHOW AT ARCADE THEATRE.

Thursday, June 21, 1917, at 2 p. m. No Contribution.

The Oregon Social Hygiene society will give a free performance of their motion picture film "How Life Begins" at the Arcade theatre on Thursday, June 21, at 2 p. m. The four reel film shows the facts of reproduction in an inspiring and highly interesting manner. A drop of water is placed on a slide and examined

through the microscope. At once is seen a swarming mass of life—the simplest forms that exist. The reproduction and development of the geranium as typical of all plant life and of the sea urchin, the swallow-tail butterfly, the frog and the rat as representative of the animal kingdom are shown in minute detail, oftentimes with the aid of the microscope. An ordinary hen's egg is opened and photographed from time to time after having been placed in the nest, and the living embryo chick is plainly visible. The heart may be seen beating and the blood flowing through the semi-transparent veins. A really wonderful picture can be seen at the Arcade next Thursday night and the whole town is invited to be there.
