Chauncey Hawkins, prominent author and lecturer, who brings a fine entertainment to the La Grande Chautauqua this year, was formerly one of the best known of our big game hunters. A few years ago he gave up the gun for the camera and has since become recognized as one of the most adventurous and successful wild animal photographers in the country. He has had unusual success in photographing moose, bear, deer and other big game native to our North American Continent.

His lecture at Chautauqua, "Wild Hearts and Bright Eyes of Our Northern Woods" will be illustrated with some of his wonderful pictures. Hawkins is one of the most sought after men on the Chautauqua platform, and his illustrated lecture will be one of the longest remembered events of the entire week. He has also written several other books which are important contributions to our American literature.
