

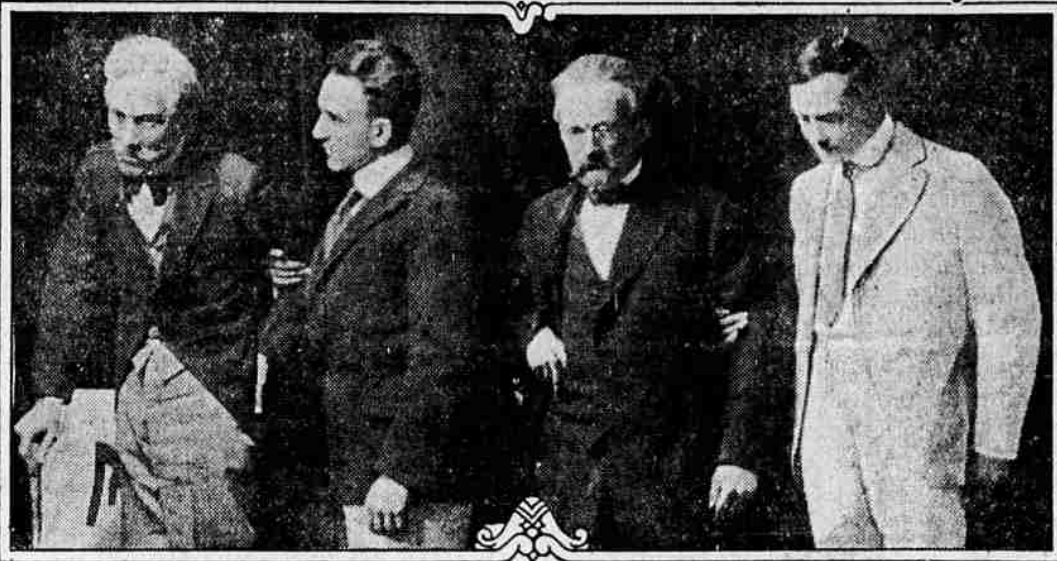
"BOHEMIAN GIRL" IS CHAUTAUQUA RED LETTER ATTRACTION

Washington, June 16.—(Special)—The interstate commerce commission's order permitting the transportation of explosives by express train or in express cars in passenger trains was amended to restrict such shipments

to emergency requirements of the army or navy.
