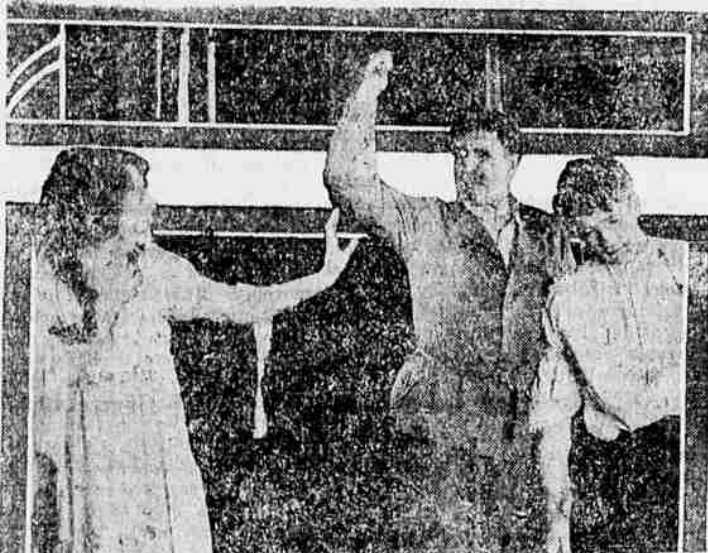

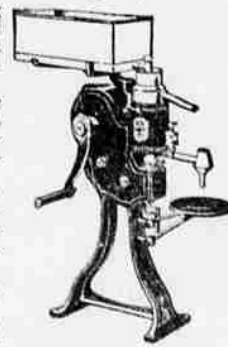

### JOBS AND WAR

ONLY TEMPORARY

London, June 21.—(United Press)—

Appearing before an army tribunal recently a firm of munition importers claimed exemption for a man 28 years old because of indispensability. The importers asserted their business had been increased \$20,000,000 by the war, partially through the efforts of the man for whom they claimed exemption.
