# CHRISTIAN CONVENTION IS OPENED

LARGE NUMBER OF DELEGATES ARE PRESENT—C. H. HILTON GIVES ADDRESS—DISCUSSIONS ARE LIVELY

The Eastern Oregon State Convention of Christian Churches is in session this week in La Grande. A large number of delegates are present from this part of the state. Some of the ministers present are: H. H. Hubbell, of Pendleton; Davis Errett, Athena; F. A. Ross, Milton; O. P. Burris, The Dalles; C. H. Hilton, Baker; Wm. E. Dean, Richland; Jasper Bogue, Walla; E. C. Sanderson, Eugene. Among those present from outside the

state are W. G. Menzies, India; W. H. Hanna, Philippines; Grant K. Lewis, Cincinnati, Ohio; Mrs. Terry King, Texas.

The address last night was given by C. H. Hilton, of Baker, on the "Genius of Christianity." In a clear, forceful manner he brought the whole world before the present generation.

A lively discussion was precipitated this morning by two papers. One by Dr. S. A. Roe, of Pendleton, on "What the Man in the Pew Needs From the Man in the Pulpit." The other was by Albyn Essen, of Albany, on "What the Man in the Pulpit Needs From the Man in the Pew."

"You must make the Bible interesting," said Dr. Roe. "I like to know something about a text I had not thought of before. Suggest, question, stimulate. Arouse the curiosity. Always use the laws of suggestion by speaking in positive terms. Adapt the lesson to every-day life. The teachings of the Bible can be made alive by fitting them to present day sins and needs. Thus far might the minister be excused for lecturing on politics or some issues of the day—if he can show how the Bible teachings solve the problem."
