#### TAILINGS TO BE USED ON COUNTY ROADS

Spokane, Wash., July 17.—(United Press)—The elimination of waste and the construction of good roads at small expense were taken into consideration by the county commissioners of Spokane county when they decided to use tailings from the mines in the Wardner-Kellogg, district in road work. Four miles of county road will be improved this summer with tailings. "This material was used in the construction of a section of highway out of Fairfield 10 years ago and for the paving of the principal streets in Fairfield and Rockfort, and has proven to be one of the best and most lasting ever placed in this county," said Commissioner J. S. Bishop today.
