"Let everybody who can't fight or buy bonds destroy a new two-cent stamp every day. We're all doing it. It means \$7.30 a year for the government—almost all clear profit."

COUNTY AGRICULTURIST WRITES ON FOLLOWING

Good farming always brings its rewards in this or any other country. Sometimes it almost seems as though the man who does the good farming, only reward is the satisfaction of having done the thing well. And while the average yields may be somewhat higher than his neighbors who have farmed so carefully and who maintain it doesn't pay to put in the extra time, these same neighbors this year are cussing their luck and commenting how lucky the careful farmer is because he usually hits it when an off season comes along. And often the prices in the fall of the unfavorable season are fairly good and the thorough man is well paid for the extra time and labor he has put in during other, and particularly the previous season. If you do not believe this statement drive out on the Sand Ridge and notice Charley Playle's Forty-fold wheat which will be ready to begin harvesting in a week or so. It is probably the outstanding large field of winter wheat in the valley. And why this splendid wheat? Look at the crop of wheat on the east side of the road, then take a look at the summer fallow on the other side of the road and the question is largely answered. Early and careful plowing and thorough cultivation tell the tale. You see no weeds, and you will see very few during the growing season. Last
