coronation of King Alfonso XIII of Spain.

He was with the Russian army in the Boxer rebellion.

About him the London Morning Advertiser said:  
"Mr. Frederick Coleman, the well-known American war correspondent, has acted as correspondent for prominent New York and London newspapers throughout four wars, and has come into especially close touch with the various bodies of troops with which he has campaigned.

"Mr. Coleman's acquaintance with the American, Spanish and Filipino armies ripened during the Spanish-American War and the Philippine insurrection. During the bombardment of Tientsin at the commencement of the last Chinese war, he lived with the Russian army in the Russian camp. He watched the operations of British, Americans, Japanese, Russian, French and Chinese troops, in the early part of the war. He campaigned with various of these contingents, and the Indian contingent during the forepart of the advance of the Peking Relief Expedition. He

marched with the Japanese advance for five days from Yang Tsun to Tung Chou and was the only foreign correspondent with the Russian contingent which forced its way, first of the Allies into the city of Peking, thus being the first correspondent with the relief expedition to enter Peking. He studied all the other troops in China, among them Count Waldersee's Germans, who arrived in China after the relief of Peking. The war in China in 1900 thus gave him a close insight into the personal attributes of the fighting men of many nations.

"Few young men have had an opportunity of seeing more of interest than Mr. Coleman has seen in various parts of the world. Newspaper work has carried him over a vast amount of territory. The latter part of the Japan-China war found him in the Far East, and before he returned home to the United States, he was sent to most of the large cities of the Orient, his journey including a trip through India. An incident in connection with a revolution in South America took him southward, and showed him something of Central America and Mexico on his return journey. The bursting of the Spanish war cloud gave him the opportunity for two more years of war correspondence. He went to the Philippines with the first expedition from the United States, and was one of the first Americans to land on Philippine soil during the Spanish-American War. The war with Spain concluded, Mr. Coleman spent a year and a half reporting the Philippine insurrection

and exploring unknown islands in the Philippine group. From that work he was called to China in the Boxer outbreak of 1900.

"At the close of hostilities in China, Mr. Coleman came to London, where he has since made his home. He has lectured extensively and with great success throughout the United Kingdom and gained also a reputation as a writer. . . ."

In the present war Mr. Coleman was for ten months with the British Expeditionary force in France. He spent some months with the British cavalry.

**PORTLAND MARKET LETTER**

July 26th  
The receipts at the Portland and Union Stock yards today are very light with a little comparative increase in the sheep house, with a general inclination to the stock grades in all departments. The offering in the cattle market was almost entirely cows and the market showed considerable signs of strength

which resulted in a slight increase of probably 25c. The volume of business although small was moved promptly, the supply not being up to the demand.

**Cattle**  
Quotations remain the same on cattle though there were some signs of strength in the cow line. A number of buyers were in the yards seeking feeders and did not find supply equal to the demand.

**Hogs.**  
There are no changes in the quotations on hogs. Market conditions are steady both in the stockers and packer classes.

**Sheep.**  
The sheep market continues somewhat drabby. The demand and the supply being just about balanced with a slow movement at current prices. There are no changes in prices from the previous week.
