PORTLAND MARKET LETTER.

July 27

A light run of 150 cattle was about equally divided among beef steers, cows, and feeders. The 2 car loads of steers might have been classed as good smooth feeders but carried sufficient kill to get them across in the beef class and they went over the scales at 7.50.

Feeders and cows were divided up in several classes bringing from 4.50 to 6.50, but were not typical for their several classes. The market quotations on the material should remain about the same.

Hogs

About 400 hogs came to the yards during the day and were delivered immediately from the chutes to the scales, at steady prices without close distinction as to classes.

Sheep

The sheep market still continues to drag more or less the movement being not so prompt as in the hog alleys but everything was sold from the yards before 2 o'clock at 10.75 to 12.50 for lambs and 8 to 8.50 for wethers.
