MARY PICKFORD IN THRILLING, PATRIOTIC FILM

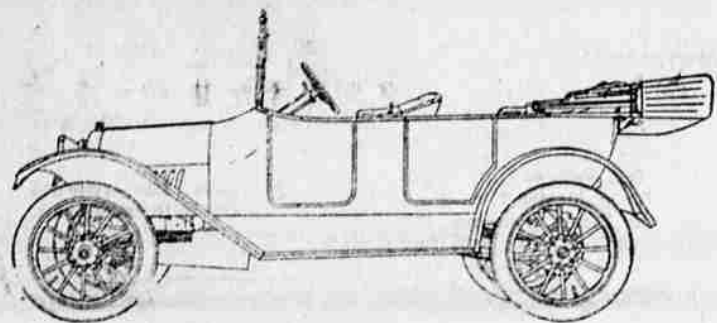
