J. 1st Infantry, Hawaii, H. T., Aug. 15-17. My Dear Mother: Received your loving present and was sure glad to get them as they come in very handy. How is Everett and Beth getting along? Give my love to the old folks and Uncle Harry. I am having a fine time over here. It is warm and sunny the year round. I was down to Honolulu last week. While I was there I went down to the Beach of Wakaii and went in swimming. The sand on the beach is as white as snow. They have got a big museum with all kinds of fishes of the tropics. There is some flying fish there too. I am getting along fine with the rifle drill and I like it. Tell Everett and Beth to write me a letter. Am going for a hike down to Helewa, that is a little town by the sea side, nine miles from the Barracks. The mountains here are of volcanic eruptions, and they're sure steep. There are parts that are so steep that no one has ever been on them. There are lots of mountain sheep and wild hogs here. The native fruit is very

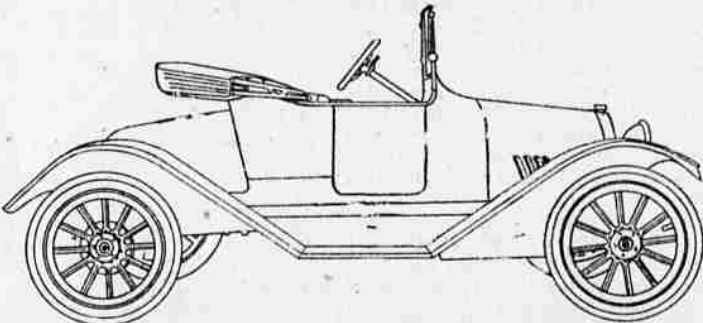
