In the evening the veterans will attend a camp-fire when prominent officers of the organization will speak.

DEER SEASON DATES

Judge Robert S. Eakin, Jr., has received a letter from Attorney General G. M. Brown explaining the conflict of dates of the open season for deer as it appears in the Game Laws of 1917.

The letter points out that the date August 15 to October 31 was set by previous legislatures. The open season as fixed by the legislature of 1917 is from September 1 to October 31 and being a later act must prevail over the date previously set.

The bag limit for one season is two deer with horns.

FEMININE SMOKERS BOOST UNCLE SAM'S REVENUE.

Washington, Aug. 23.—(United Press)—Since sister Susie learned to blow smoke rings through her nose and took to carrying her cigarettes in jeweled cases, Uncle Sam's revenue has been boosted more than \$12,000,000, according to official figures here. Receipts from taxes on all forms of tobacco showed this increase, and the biggest jump was in cigarettes. Feminine devotees of the weed are believed responsible for a big part of the gain in revenue.

ASSOCIATION TO PROMOTE CHINESE TRADE.

Canton, China, July 21.—(By mail)—Relations between China and America, which have registered many evidences lately of their increasing importance now and after the war, have been given impetus in the formation of the Chinese-American association here.

Chung Wing-Kwong, vice-president of the Canton Christian College, heads the new organization which aims to promote trade and other forms of intercourse between the two nations. Returned students from the United States are taking an active part in the work.

TWO AMERICANS AWARDED MILITARY CROSS.

London, August 1.—(By mail)—(United Press)—Two American lieutenants of the Canadian army today wear the Military Cross as a reward for their bravery and leadership under fire. A. H. Pannill, of Chatham, Va., and Donald MacRae, of Washington, D. C., whose father is in the adjutant-general's office, were decorated by King George in recognition of their valor.

Pannill, at Vimy Ridge took command of a company, captured part of a second-line trench and established a machine-gun position in a crater beyond the trench. His command suffered severe casualties. Pannill himself, though wounded by shrapnel, remained on the job for 24 hours consolidating the gains. He recently transferred to the Royal Flying Corps.

MacRae found that his major's crown was keeping him out of action because the army needed active lieutenants and was plentifully supplied with major officers. The Washington man was so anxious to fight that he "pulled two stars" from his sleeve and took the rank of lieutenant. The act for which he received the Military Cross was performed on the Vimy front some time before the big assault.

Portland, Ore., Aug. 22.—(United Press)—George Havnie has on file a claim for exemption because he is an officer in the Oregon Humane society. He was given a deputy sheriff's appointment early this week.
