French-Canadian Is The Unsolved Problem In Canada

(Third Article of Series) Ottawa, Canada, August 25—(United Press)—The French-Canadian is the unsolved riddle of the Dominions. To the British colonist the attitude of the French-Canadian during the war has been inexplicable.

"Canada," said Bourassa, "has already made a military display in men and money proportionately superior to that of any nation engaged in the war."

"An increase in our war expense will spell national bankruptcy and threaten the economic life of the nation and eventually its independence. Conscription means strife and disunion in Canada. It will hurt the cause of the Allies to a greater extent than it will help."
