NEW YORK BANK OPENS UP BRANCH IN PARIS

New York, Sept. 5.—(United Press)—The announcement last week that one of the most conservative banking institutions in America, the Guaranty Trust Company of New York, had opened a Paris branch to handle the already rapidly increasing volume of French business, comes as a surprise to Americans generally who had not realized how surprisingly the French are rallying from the crushing blow war has dealt her commerce. In 1914, the year the War's outbreak, imports from France to this country totaled

\$141,446,252. This total was reduced to \$77,158,740 in 1915, but last year French imports to America rose to \$102,077,060.

Conspicuous in this revival is the reconstruction of her railroads in which American railroad men are playing so active a part. Samuel M. Felton, president of the Chicago Great Western Railroad, who has been appointed War Department director of war roads of the United States Government, has raised a force of 10,000 railroad workers and sent them to France, and is now raising another equal force for the same purpose. Leaders in American finance ascribe
