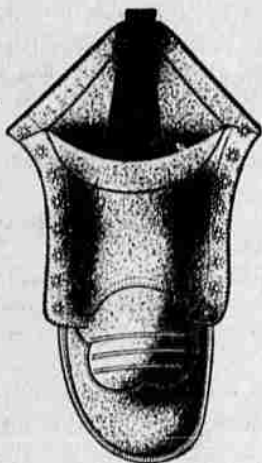

Letters From The Front

The following letter has been received from Orion McNown of the Hospital Unit:

Long Island, Sept. 6, 1917.

Dear Folks at Home:
Well, we arrived all O. K. and feeling fine.

We left Clackamas at 8:20 a. m. Saturday and arrived at Long Island Thursday morning about four o'clock. We marched to the barracks which was about one mile from Garden City, Long Island. We put up our own tents. There is between one hundred and fifty and two hundred thousand soldiers here.

There are two hundred and fifty deserters from the state of N. Y. I have been told they will have to suffer a severe penalty.

Well, after leaving La Grande, our next stop was Pocatello. Took on a big feed which I sure relished.

La Grande sure showed their patriotism toward the hospital unit. Our next was Green River. There for ten minutes.

When we got to Julesburg, Colo., I sent Uncle Otis a telegram that I would be in Omaha at eight p. m. We were an hour late and when we got there, found instead of Uncle Otis, Uncle Will, Blim, Lev, and Owen. I believe you told me it was 80 miles from Peru to Omaha. They made it in 2 hours and 40 minutes in their cars. We were there just 30 minutes. How we did ramble after leaving Omaha. As we were going through some portion of Iowa it rained on us and cooled thing off. The corn and hay crops looked fine through Nebr. and Iowa. We stopped two hours to get in the heart of the two hours to get in the heart of the city. Took in a museum of a rt and went out to the Lake. You can't see across it. It makes me think of the ocean. Large steamers come up to Chicago. We rode along the Lake about two hours. Chicago is sure some city and a wet one too. In every block there are from 8 to 10 saloons and the streets are jammed with people. There is only one railroad that crosses the Hudson river and that is 250 feet from the water and two miles long. N. Y. is some city of itself. We went under the Hudson river coming in and under it going over to Long Island. They had us put out our lights and were not allowed to smoke while we were going through the tube under Hudson. There is too much gas. They use an electric engine to pull us through. There are about three aeroplanes flying from 5 o'clock in the morning until 5 at night, and plenty of mosquitoes. They Y. M. C. A. here is full all the time. I should judge from the mass of
