New York, Sunday, Sept. 9  
Dear Folks at Home:

I really am in New York now. Been in for 24 hours. This is said to be the largest city in the world, and I guess it is, although I am disappointed in part of it, the streets especially. Broadway is all torn up, and lots of them are made of cobble stones. On some streets you can see and hear three railways going at once—elevated, electric cars and subway. Haven't tried the Subway yet except under the Hudson.

There is not much to see here except lots of business and plenty of saloons. Have seen several buildings. Couldn't find the Woolworth yesterday—was so small, I guess—but found it today and proceeded to go to the top of it. They charge 50 cents to go up, but it was worth \$5.00. I took some pictures, but it was so foggy that I do not think they will be much good. Cameras were not allowed on top, but I had mine in my pocket. It looks like you were a mile high instead of a little less than 700 feet. The observation tower is just 60 stories above ground.

Another good sight is Broadway at night. The theatres certainly do a good business here. The Hippodrome was packed last night, so Ayars and I had to go to the Realto. They have a 50 piece orchestra there which was fine. Douglas Fairbanks appeared in person and gave a short talk. He had just returned from Cheyenne and was just going to Pendleton to take in the Round-Up.

There are about 55 ships out in the harbor now and tars are thicker than soldiers on the streets. Nearly every one has a different name on his hat cord.

This town is not so big as it might be. Ayars and I simply can't get lost. We always find ourselves back where we started from somehow. You can tell it is pretty big when you start out to find something, though. I haven't seen a pretty girl here yet, and Chicago was just loaded with 'em. Also Chicago has busier streets than this burg. A person needs a month to really see this town all over. The streets are not impossible to cross, as some books have said. There is no skulduggery going on (which is our word for meanness) as we can see. It is cooler here than there and prices are much more reasonable. Ayars and I got a dozen oysters apiece (fried) for 30 cents awhile ago and the other day I got a shave, hair cut, message and tonic on my hair for 75 cents. But the money goes somehow. About two more times in New York is all I can stand. Nearly everything is closed on Sunday, and they don't even sell souvenirs at the Woolworth building.

Nobody knows when we are going to leave for France. Graham says by the 15th of this month, though, and so many battle ships being in the harbor looks like it. We have the tough Alabama bunch bluffed—they think we are gunmen. Wild and woolly west, you know. There were 15 new men added to our company the other day from Maryland. Another Hospital Corps came in from Nebraska Saturday morning. There now is one, three and four here. Two is yet to come. We have had no drill yet.

We nearly froze the first night here. I had three blankets over and three under me, but they did not seem to do much good. The next night I put my tick under and shelter half over and got by all right. It rained though, and was warmer. They made us get up in the rain—that is some of them got up, but I got wise and stayed in bed. The sergeants stayed in bed also.

When I have the pictures developed I will send them to you. I have been "shooting" airships out at camp, but don't know whether they are good or
