Palmer Valley, Sept. 17.—(Special.)—There was quite a fire at Palmer Junction on the 9th of the month. Three men were batching in the John Miller cabin and while cooking supper noticed a spark in the roof and started to the creek for water, but before they got back the whole house was in flames. It burned to the ground. The parties who were batching there said they lost \$250 in clothes, bedding and other things.
