Grant's tomb. Saw all the clothes and flags he used in the civil war. Saw the battle ships lying in the harbor and some row boats. Saw the President's yacht, the Mayflower. We went to a theater Saturday night. Some play. The first play I have seen in years. And who do you suppose came in and sat in a box right under us, but President Wilson. I thought there would be a public panic for a few minutes. Everyone tried to see him first and how they yelled and clapped. Looks like any other man to me. We went through Chinatown and the Bowery. All the same as Barbara Coast, 'Frisco. Some tough place, believe me. Went through Wall street and the fine residence part of the town. Saw Trinity Church and cemetery and the two Brooklyn bridges and the largest fish packing concern in the world. Broadway sure is some sight at night. So many pretty electric signs. Saw the roof garden where Thaw killed S. White. Well, how is everything in La Grande? I get a letter from Mother nearly every day. Sure is getting cold here nights.
