Two In One---A Jacket and Cape



KOLINSKY gives this nattiest of perky models, a surplised jacket buttoned as snugly as any vest and suggestive of sleeves and a wide fur belt, while the back is cut in a flaring cape finished around the bottom with a banding of the fur running its stripes circularly. This garment cries out for youth to carry it.

Some of the cape coats are of a distinctly sport character, fashioned from plaids, black checks, gay wool velours, tweeds or jerseys. Others are designed more especially for street or travel purposes, and among these are some particularly good looking dust gray models in fine soft serge or twill. Paris is very fond of this material and color for all kinds of tourist coats, and it is good, too, in separate capes for travel or motorcar. Long, ample and enveloping, such a garment is warranted to protect the frock or suit worn beneath, although for hard motoring it is not desirable save perhaps for extra warmth or protection over a coat. The cape is not taut enough. It is prone to fluttering or flying, and floppiness is the unpardonable thing in the motor wrap that asks to be taken seriously.

Serge frocks for autumn show considerable trimming in the way of tinsel and silk floss embroidery. While contrasting colors are used, however, they are rather subdued in tone.

One interesting coat recently seen had no fewer than six pockets, but nevertheless pockets were not a conspicuous feature of the model—this because they were so cleverly arranged.
