ALFRED GROUPE IS ASSIGNED TO BATTERY B.

A letter from Alfred Groupe, of La Grande, to his brother Olaf Groupe, who was recently drafted into the new National Army:

Camp Lewis, Sept. 27.—Dear Brother Olaf: I am now assigned to Battery B, 346 Field Artillery, but I might be transferred to something else later on.

We are taking measure for hats, suits, underwear and shoes today so we don't have to go out and drill. Otherwise they drill us every day except Sundays, when we only have to answer roll call. We were mustered in last Saturday. Had to go through an examination at which there were about a dozen doctors present to examine you. They also filled out a lot of papers about you and after that we got vaccinated. This makes a lot of the fellows sick, but it never feazed me.

I passed a clear examination except for a couple of teeth, and in a few days we will have a dentist to fix all of them. They have several hospitals here and also six or eight Y. M. C. A's. They are building a Y. M. C. A right across the street from our barracks and it will be ready sometime this week. On the other side there is a post exchange, where you can buy anything you need.

In our barracks there are none but choice men; all of them big huskies. Talk about your crowds, you ought to see it here about 8 o'clock of an evening. There is sure square dancing, especially around the Y. M. C. A's, and the stores.

This life isn't so bad with good officers and lots of good grub. Their rules are sure strict though, and what's more you have to live up to them. At present we are taking the foot drills and exercises.

The boys from Union and Wallova Counties are all in this barrack. I had a letter from Mary the other day and will try and answer it soon. It was about the first letter that arrived here at the barracks.

Tomorrow I go on K. P. (kitchen notice) and don't have to drill. They have seven men each day to wait on tables and clean the dining room.

I hope mother is getting along all right. I'll try and write again soon. With love to mother. AL.

P. S.—I am sitting on my cot and writing this, so it's not very neat.

SALVATION ARMY CONTINGENT ARRIVES IN FRANCE

A cablegram from Lieut. Colonel Wm. Barker, in command of Salvation Army operations in France, announces the safe arrival of the second contingent of Salvationists.

This party of workers left Chicago three weeks ago. It consisted of eight officers, two of whom are women. They go to take charge of Huts and Hospitals which the Salvation Army is erecting at the American base.

Six hundred and twenty Salvationists are now in France operating Huts, Hospitals, rest rooms and ambulances. The Salvationists have 15 ambulances in readiness to send to France as soon as the American troops require them; while twelve more will also soon be in readiness. These ambulances will all be manned by Salvationists. Thirty-six are now operated by the Salvation Army in France, Egypt and Russia which have already carried over 50,000 wounded soldiers from the battlefields. One hundred and fifty-three Huts, and seventy-five hospitals with accommodations for four thousand men have already been erected in France, Belgium and England.

More than 30,000 Salvationists are enlisted in the British Army alone besides those in other forces and their bravery is attested by the fact that four have been awarded the Victoria Cross, seven have received distinguished service medals and one had won the King of Serbia's medal.

Salvation Army officers have been appointed by different governments as army chaplains.

The Salvation Army of other lands has expended almost a million dollars in its war activities and the organiza-

tion in this country is endeavoring to raise \$200,000 to defray the expenses of its work among American soldiers in France in this country.

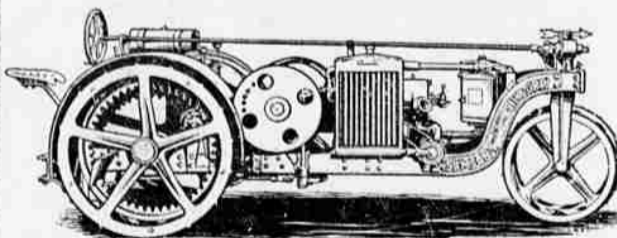
BUTTE BUTCHERS WILL WALK OUT FRIDAY
